From our Vicar



early beloved in Christ,

Warm Greetings in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

With a heart full of gratitude and humility, I write to you as the Vicar of CSI Immanuel Cathedral. Many of you may remember that after my BD studies, I joined here as the Assistant Vicar in 2001. Those days were very special to me. This place became a space of formation for me, where I grew in faith and experienced the depth of God's grace. This church has been part of some of the most important moments of my life. While I was serving here, I received my first and second ordinations, and it was here that I was united in marriage. Today I stand before you with a deep sense of belonging, responsibility, and reverence for what God has been doing, and I commit myself, along with my family, to walk together with this vibrant faith community. As we move forward, may our

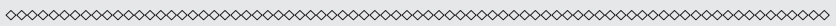
Cathedral not only be known for its heritage, but for its harmony; not only for its worship, but for its witness; not only for its structure, but for its living testimony of unity in Christ.

With Heartfelt Gratitude

Dear friends

Loving greetings!!

The Holy Bible reminds us in Ecclesiastes that “to everything there is a season.” (Ecclesiastes 3:1) Life does not move in a straight, unbroken line; it unfolds in a sacred rhythm—arrival and departure, speech and silence, sowing and reaping. If beginnings are gifts, endings are wisdom. And now, within that rhythm of time, I find myself invited to say goodbye. As I say goodbye, I would like to express our gratitude to many people at Immanuel Cathedral. First of all, I thank the editorial board of this newsletter. For me, this pub-

lication has been a shared space of reflection during my tenure as Vicar of Immanuel Cathedral. Within these pages, we have encountered one another in thought and in spirit. As this message marks the final one of its kind from me, in this month’s newsletter, I wish to thank the Pastorate committee members, Diocesan council members, leaders and members of Sunday School, Youth fellowship, Women’s fellowship, Men’s Fellowship, Family Care fellowship, Senior Citizens fellowship, and coordinators of Feeding the Needy programme. Choir, because their contribution to organize the worship services in our church was inestimable. My gratitude to them is beyond words; once again, thank you all.

I would like to conclude this brief write-up with the simple and enduring blessing of St. Paul: “The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you. My love be with you all in Christ Jesus. Amen” (1 Corinthians 16:23-24) Here, Paul reminds us of what truly matters in our day-to-day Christian life: grace and love. When he says, “The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you,” he points to the gift of God in Jesus Christ, a grace that sustains us even in our weakness and failures. When he adds, “My love be with you all in Christ Jesus,” he shows that faith is not just about beliefs, but about relationships shaped by Christ’s love. Together, grace and love form the heart of Christian life, grace received from Christ, and love shared with oth-

ers. These final words are not just a farewell, but a gentle call to live each day in His grace and to reflect His love in our community. Thus, as I say goodbye, I pray that my farewell may be in the same spirit as Paul the Apostle. For him, a farewell was never an announcement of finality, but an expression of hope rooted in grace. Distance did not mean abandonment, nor did absence imply loss; both were held within the larger horizon of God’s faithful purposes. He entrusted the community to God’s abiding grace, trusting that what is sustained by divine love can never truly be disconnected. Every parting, therefore, points beyond itself toward that greater reunion in eternity, where faith shall become sight and fellowship shall know no end.

Goodbye, Immanuel family. Thank you, one and all, for your sincere love and care. May God bless you all.

This year's Vacation Bible School was nothing short of a beautiful adventure with God's guiding hand. VBS commenced on 6th April with an inaugural ceremony filled with reverence and joy, led by Rev. John Joseph. The presence of Rev. John Joseph, Rev. Lalji, Mr. Vargis Jacob (our Church Treasurer), and Mr. Benjamin Vedanayakam (Sunday School Superintendent) made the occasion even more special.

The theme "Safari Vibes - Journeying with Christ" was inspired by Proverbs 3:6: "In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths." Our youth volunteers brought this theme to life with a

lively skit, setting the stage for the days ahead.



Each morning, the children gathered eagerly for the main sessions led by Mr. Varghese Abraham (Jomy), our VBS Director, alongside his dedicated team Mr. Dhyana Skaria and Mr. Abel Abraham. 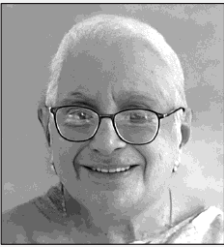

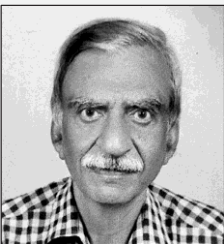
